The Maturity Question

Good questions result in **BETTER** decisions resulting in **FEWER** regrets.

- 1. (Super-Power) Ask / Answer Honestly / Act with Integrity
- 2. Honesty Question: Am I being honest with myself, REALLY?
- 3. Legacy Question: What STORY do I want to tell?
- 4. Conscience Question: Is there a TENSION that deserves my ATTENTION?

- 3. Would you commit to asking—not acting on—but simply asking the wisdom question for **seven days** every time you make a decision?
