Colossians 3:18-4:1

The world's view of authority = <u>Power</u> to <u>dominate</u> others.

But, . . . Jesus' view of authority = power to serve others in love. (Mark 10:43-44)

- 1. Paul was calling all believers to give more than was expected of them in love.
- 2. Paul was subtly <u>undermining</u> the social order by giving those without power, the <u>power</u> to <u>choose</u> love.
- 3. The motive for going beyond expectations, is God's love and grace for us.

Our experience of God's grace ought to change . . .

- 1) Our general <u>attitude</u>. (to one of gratitude and humility, vs. entitlement and self-focus)
- 2) Our <u>perspective</u>. (one that sees others through the lens of the cross, not one of power)
- 3) Our <u>purpose</u>. (to love and honor God by loving and honoring others)
- **4) Our application of truth.** (for me, not for thee)
- **5) Our motivation.** (the grace that God's shown us)
