The kindness of God is a major theme of the Bible. However, many think of Him as being a harsh and angry God. Where does this idea come from? The Scriptures teach that God is patient toward us and full of kindness and grace (Ps. 63:3; 136:1; Rm. 2:4).

Perhaps no story in the Bible reveals God's kindness more than the story of King David and the grace that he showed to a crippled son of Jonathan (2 Sam. 4:4). Not only is the Lord's kindness portrayed in this story, but also the very Gospel of Jesus Christ.

In our text, King David showed God's kindness and grace to a crippled son of Jonathan named Mephibosheth.
