



## The Two Great Commandments

Matthew 22:34-40; 23:1-4

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Imagine standing under Niagara Falls with a tin cup. That's how The Twelve must have felt walking with Jesus day by day. They witnessed wonderous works of God's power, grace, and truth, and yet, they were only able to capture a fraction of what Jesus was revealing to them.

In addition, the Scribes and Pharisees had devised 613 "laws" from the Torah (248 positive & 365 negative) that all Jews were required to keep. Centuries later these were written in the Talmud. But a lawyer's question about the law gave Jesus an opportunity to keep it simple.

In our text, Jesus answered a Pharisaic lawyer who asked about the greatest commandment in the law, and the twelve were listening.
