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To understand the meaning of John 10 we need to know the context. John 9:1-10:39 is all a part of one story: The Jews, and especially the self-righteous pharisees believed that they had favored access to God because of their legalistic righteousness. Jesus supernaturally healed a hopeless blind man. He opened his eyes and gave this man abundant life. He then explained to the pharisees and those around him that the only way to God was through him. He did this by using the analogy of the Shepherd.
