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Have you ever heard the phrase, "Crossing Jordan?" This expression has come to mean a significant milestone or turning point in one's life. It signifies a decisive moment of faith and commitment from which there is no turning back.

Before Julius Caesar led his army to cross the Rubicon or George Washington led his army to cross the Delaware, Joshua led the Israelites to cross the Jordan. The Jordan represented the dividing line between fear and faith, aimless wandering and possessing the land.

In our text, God parted the Jordan River in flood season so that His people could go forward in faith to take the Promised Land.
