Today, Christians around the world celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ. As the Son of Man, Jesus said that He "did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many" (Mt. 20:28).

However, the Bible also says that He "was declared to be the Son of God by His resurrection for the dead" (Rm. 1:4). The empty tomb declares that Jesus is not merely another dead prophet, but He is the Son of God.
