1. Revelation Has a Central Figure The book of Revelation is not merely a collection of symbols, prophecies, or apocalyptic imagery—it is a revelation of Jesus Christ. Its purpose is to unveil His majesty and display His deity to the world. Jesus is both the revealer and the revealed, making Him the focus of this book.	
2. Revelation Has a Clear Purpose The purpose of Revelation is to show God's servants "what must soon take place" (Rev. 1:1). This book equips believers to live ready for the last days by revealing future events and reminding us of our identity as surrendered servants of Christ.	
3. Revelation Has a Certain Promise Revelation 1:3 assures us of a unique blessing for those who read, hear, and obey its words. This promise emphasizes the importance of engaging with Revelation faithfully and highlights the urgency of its message because "the time is near."
