



Sermon-Based GC Discussion Questions

3/22/2026

Title of Sermon: *From Here to There*

Main Point of Sermon: Because God Himself is our dwelling place, we must live with urgency, find our joy in Him, and invest our lives in a work that outlives us.

Launching Question:

- What is one place or memory that has felt like “home” to you—and why?
- When was the last time you were reminded of how short life is? How did it affect you?

Primary Scripture: Psalm 90

Discussion Questions:

- Read Psalm 90:1–2. What does it mean that God is our “dwelling place,” and how is that different from finding security in a physical place or season?
- In Psalm 90:3–11, Moses reflects on the brevity and frailty of life. What images or phrases stand out to you, and what do they reveal about the human condition?
- Read Psalm 90:12. What does it look like practically to “number our days,” and how does that lead to wisdom?
- In Psalm 90:14–15, Moses prays for satisfaction and joy in God—even in affliction. How is this different from how the world pursues happiness?
- Read Psalm 90:16–17. What does it mean for God to “establish the work of our hands”? What kind of work is Moses pointing toward?

Application Questions:

- Where are you currently tempted to find your “home” or security outside of God (career, comfort, relationships, success)?
- If you truly believed your days were numbered, what would change about how you spend your time this week?
- What does it look like for you personally to pursue satisfaction in God daily rather than in circumstances or achievements?
- Are you living more for comfort or for eternal impact right now? What is one practical shift you can make?
- What is one way you can invest your life into something that will outlive you—spiritually, relationally, or missionally?

Prayer Focus:



- Number Our Days – Ask God to give you a heart of wisdom and help you live with urgency for what matters most.
- Satisfy Our Souls – Pray that God would deepen your joy in Him, even in difficult or uncertain seasons.
- Establish Our Work – Ask God to use your life for lasting kingdom impact that extends beyond your lifetime and into future generations.
