

SHOW ME THE FRUIT!

John said to the crowds coming out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? *Produce fruit in keeping with repentance.*

And do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I tell you that out of these stones God can raise up children for Abraham. The ax is already at the root of the trees, and every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire." Luke 3:7-9 (NIV)

Three Ways God Expects Us To Show Our Fruit:

1. By practicing <u>GENEROSITY</u>!

"What should we do then?" the crowd asked. John answered, "Anyone who has two shirts should share with the one who has none, and anyone who has food should do the same." Luke 3:10-11 (NIV)

Remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He Himself said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive. Acts 20:35b (NIV)

The giver is happier than the getter!

Giving is not God's way of taking something from you. Giving is God's way of getting something to you.

Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment.

Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share. In this way they will lay up treasure for themselves as a firm foundation for the coming age, so that they may take hold of the life that is truly life. **1 Timothy 6:17-19 (NIV)**

2. By practicing <u>HONESTY</u>!

Even tax collectors came to be baptized. "Teacher," they asked, "what should we do?" "Don't collect any more than you are required to," he told them. Luke 3:12-13 (NIV)

3. By practicing <u>CONTENTMENT</u>!

Then some soldiers asked him, "And what should we do?" He replied, "Don't extort money and don't accuse people falsely—be content with your pay." Luke 3:14 (NIV)

For I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty.

I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do all this through *Him who gives me strength*. Philippians 4:11b-13 (NIV)
