

PLAYING DEFENSE AGAINST OFFENSE

How you handle an offense can literally make or break a relationship.

It is harder to win back the friendship of an offended brother than to capture a fortified city. His anger shuts you out like iron bars. **Proverbs 18:19 (TLB)**

Defense means...protection, security, cover, shield. **Offense** means...a wrongdoing, transgression, violation, infraction.

Our lives will only go as far as our ability to overcome offenses.

How To Play Defense Against Offense:

1. Stop being so easily offended.

My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires. **James 1:19 (NIV)**

If you cannot control your anger, you are as helpless as a city without walls, open to attack. **Proverbs 25:28 (GNT)**

2. Consider letting the offense go.

A person's wisdom yields patience; it is to one's glory to overlook an offense. Proverbs 19:11 (NIV)

3. Talk to the person who offended you, not to someone else.

If another believer sins against you, go privately and point out the offense. If the other person listens and confesses it, you have won that person back.

But if you are unsuccessful, take one or two others with you and go back again, so that everything you say may be confirmed by two or three witnesses.

If the person still refuses to listen, take your case to the church. Then if he or she won't accept the church's decision, treat that person as a pagan or a corrupt tax collector. Matthew 18:15-17 (NLT)

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4. Refuse to take up another person's offense.

The person who tells one side of a story seems right, until someone else comes and asks questions. **Proverbs 18:17 (NCV)**

5. Choose to forgive.

Be kind to each other, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God through Christ has forgiven you. Ephesians 4:32 (NLT)

> The same forgiveness we receive from God, is the same forgiveness we should extend to others.



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
