## III. THE PURPOSE HE HAD IN WRITING – v. 3

- A. His original CONCERN "our common salvation"
  - His **pastoral** concern "Beloved" (agapētos)
  - His **pressing** concern "very eager" (spoudē) hastening or speed
- B. His present **CHALLENGE**

"appealing" - (parakaleō) - exhorting, encouraging

The simple <u>Responsibility</u>
 "contend" – (epagōnizomai) athletic struggle
 Philippians 1:27

- The **Reasons** for this:
  - There is a body of truth to be believed "the faith"
  - There is a finality and completion to it "was once for all delivered" (hapax) - something that is accomplished or completed one time, with lasting results and no need of repetition.
  - There is a stewardship required of all believers "to the saints" 1 Corinthians 4:1-2; 2 Timothy 1:12
