Risk is the possibility of losing or gaining something of value as a result of an action.

Values (physical health, social status, emotional well being, financial wealth) can be gained or lost when taking risk, resulting from an action or inaction, foreseen or unforeseen.



Unit of risk – The Micromort – represents a one-in-a-million chance of sudden death.

Exposure to 1 micromort exposes you to a 1-in-a-million chance of dying.

Why not risk for something of ultimate, eternal value?

Risk in the context of our faith

Taking action in faith knowing we may lose what we value in this life, for something of eternal value.

Risk in New Testament

...our beloved Barnabas and Paul,

26 men who have **risked** their lives for the name of our

Lord Jesus Christ. – Acts 15:26

Greet Prisca and Aquila, my fellow workers in Christ Jesus, 4 who risked their necks for my life... - Romans 16:3-4

for he nearly died for the work of Christ, **risking** his life to complete what was lacking in your service to me – Philippians 2:30
