"examine" (anakrin \bar{o}) was a legal term for the investigation or inquiry made before a decision was reached in a case.

- Experience of Jesus Christ FAITH
- Fruitful Work For Christ FRUIT

Remember...

Your responsibility, by God's enabling, is to constantly apply the divine principles and truths you have heard (Phil. 2:12-13; 1 Tim. 4:7-9; James 1:22-27). As you meditate on this message, ask yourself these questions: How does God want my beliefs/actions to change? How can I accomplish this change? What is the first step toward bringing about this change?

PAUL MAINTAINS HIS LIBERTY (9:4-6)

Paul's rights include:

- The right of hospitality (9:4): Paul has earned the right to be entertained by other believers.
- The right to travel with his family (9:5–6)
- The right to enjoy financial support (9:7–12a, 13–14) 1 Timothy 5:17

DEFENDS HIS ENTITLEMENT (9:7–14)

- Warfare A soldier is paid for his services (9:7a)
- Farming A vinedresser eats the grapes he harvests (9:7b)
- Shepherding A shepherd drinks from the milk of his flock (9:7c)
- Law

Not human authority, but the law (9:8) "endure" (stegō) - "to bear or to pass over in silence"

- **Precedent** Others shared the rights (9:12)
- Priesthood A priest partakes from sacrifices he offers (9:13)

• Lord Himself

He concludes the same way the Lord did (9:14) Matt 10:10; Luke 10:7

Points To Consider:

- we should support our Christians workers.
- we need to realize our freedom in Christ may hinder the gospel at times.
- lost souls are more important than our rights!
- we need to cultivate our love for others that motivates us to place their need for the gospel above our rights.
