III. The Departure That Benefits Believers (v. 7)

“Nevertheless, I tell you the truth...”

A. The Advantage of His Absence

“It is to your advantage that I go away.”

B. The Arrival of the Advocate

“If I go, I will send him to you.”

The Helper (*Parakletos*) means:

- Advocate
- Counselor
- Defender

IV. The Conviction That Confronts the World (vv. 8–11)

“And when He comes, He will convict the world...”

convict - courtroom term, to expose, prove guilty, or bring to light.

A. Conviction Concerning Sin (v. 9)

“Concerning sin, because they do not believe in me.”

B. Conviction Concerning Righteousness (v. 10)

“Concerning righteousness, because I go to the Father...”

C. Conviction Concerning Judgment (v. 11)

“Because the ruler of this world is judged.”

Major Applications

1. **Expect resistance if you follow Christ.**
2. **Do not interpret sorrow as defeat.**
3. **Trust the Spirit’s invisible work.**
4. **Remember: conviction is mercy.**

The Spirit shines truth into darkened hearts.

- Some reject.
- Some resist.
- But some repent.
