## Beginning A NEW YEAR ON the "RIGHT" Foundation

5 Test and examine yourselves to see whether you are in the faith [in Christ] and living your lives as [committed] believers. Examine, test yourselves [not me]! Or do you not recognize this about yourselves [by an ongoing experience] that Jesus Christ is in you unless indeed you fail the test and are rejected as counterfeit? 6 But I hope you will acknowledge that we do not fail the test nor are we to be rejected. (amp.)
