*Jesus gives His followers everything they need
to live with peace after He leaves.*

I. THE PROMISE OF THE SPIRIT (vv. 25–26)

Application: *You are never alone in understanding God’s Word.
The same Spirit who taught the apostles now indwells every believer.*

Remember...

Your responsibility, by God’s enabling, is to constantly apply the divine principles and truths you have heard (Phil. 2:12-13; 1 Tim. 4:7-9; Jam 1:22-27).

As you meditate on this message, ask yourself these questions:

How does God want my beliefs/actions to change?

How can I accomplish this change?

What is the first step toward bringing about this change?

II. THE PROVISION OF PEACE (v. 27)

A. The Source of This Peace

Jesus does not offer any peace—He offers “*My peace*.”

- Peace in the face of betrayal
- Peace under the shadow of the cross
- Peace rooted in trust in the Father

B. The Superiority of This Peace

The world’s peace depends on:

- Circumstances improving
- Problems disappearing
- Control being maintained

C. The Command to Receive Peace

Application: *Peace is not found by removing fear; peace is found by trusting Christ.*

This passage teaches us that:

- We are not abandoned—we are indwelt
- We are not fearful—we are given peace
- We are not confused—we are taught by the Spirit
- We are not defeated—we are protected by Christ
