Four Goals In Methodology: NOTES **TRUTH** The proposition must be accurate and must emerge out of the text through the exegetical-theological processes. **CLARITY** Your teaching needs to have a clear purpose that can focus the teaching's planning, arrangement, and execution. RELEVANCE Relevance starts in the introduction, grows with each illustration and climaxes with clear direction. Know your audience. **INTEREST** Your teaching can be made more interesting by using supporting material that can drive clarity, bring your application to life and can provide relief and entertainment.

Session Four: Elder Oversight

ELDER CARE, GUIDANCE, & SUPPORT

Group and ministry leaders will have at least two formal check-ins per year with the elder overseeing their group or ministry. One will be in November (for January-May semester) and the other will be in July (for August-December semester). You will also need to discuss your summer plans if your group intends to alter plans for the summer. The elder overseeing your group or ministry will reach out to you directly to set up an initial meeting.

During these meetings, the elders will care and pray for you. You will discuss your group and ministry calendar, curriculum, and group and ministry health.

Before you start a new curriulum or study, you must submit the content to your elder for review and approval. You will need to submit the content at least a month prior to starting the new curriculum or study so that they have time to review it. Thus, it's preferable to have a semester based curriculum plan. You will email the proposed curriculum to your assigned elder for review. You do not need approval to study a book of the Bible verse-by-verse. However, you must teach content that is consistent with GracePoint's Statement of Faith. If you have teaching notes for lessons, please also share those with the elder before you teach.

Throughout the year, we encourage you to share prayer requests and group needs with your assigned elder. Do this in any format that works best. They are there to help, care, oversee, guide, and support you. Elder contact info can be found in the resource section of the packet.
