CROWNS IN THE NEW TESTAMENT

The New Testament mentions five different crowns that believers can receive as rewards for their faithfulness to God:

- 1. <u>Crown of Life</u>: This crown is mentioned in James 1:12 and Revelation 2:10 and is given to those who endure trials and persecution for the sake of Christ.
- 2. <u>Crown of Righteousness</u>: This crown is mentioned in 2 Timothy 4:8 and is given to those who have lived a righteous life and eagerly awaited the return of Christ.
- 3. <u>Crown of Glory</u>: This crown is mentioned in 1 Peter 5:4 and is given to pastors and leaders who faithfully shepherd and care for God's people.
- 4. <u>Incorruptible Crown</u>: This crown is mentioned in 1 Corinthians 9:25 and is given to those who discipline themselves in their spiritual life and strive to live in accordance with God's will.
- 5. <u>Crown of Rejoicing</u>: This crown is mentioned in 1 Thessalonians 2:19 and is given to those who have shared the gospel with others and have led them to Christ.

It's important to note that these crowns are not earned through human effort or merit, but are a gracious reward from God for those who have faithfully followed and served Him. It is only through our faith in Christ that we are saved, and only through our walk with Him can we complete our race.

These crowns are not royal crowns, but the crowns of conquerors. These are laid down before the throne by those who overcame, not in their own might, but through the blood of the Lamb (Revelation 12:11).

These are the crowns, that Revelation 4:10 speaks of being cast before the throne of Christ, together with the falling down and worshipping; the sign of humiliation before the King and Lord, in whose presence no creature whatever has any glory or honor of its own.
