Philippians 1:20 ²⁰ according to my earnest expectation and hope, that I will not be put to shame in anything, but *that* with all boldness, Christ will even now, as always, be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death.

Philippians 1:21–30 (NASB95)

- ²² But if I am to live on in the flesh, this will mean fruitful labor for me; and I do not know which to choose.
- ²³ But I am hard-pressed from both directions, having the desire to depart and be with Christ, for that is very much better; ²⁴ yet to remain on in the flesh is more necessary for your sake.
 - ²⁵ Convinced of this, I know that I will remain and continue with you all for your progress and joy in the faith,
 - ²⁶ so that your proud confidence in me may abound in Christ Jesus through my coming to you again.

so that whether I come and see you or remain absent, I will hear of you that you are standing firm in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel;

- ²⁸ in no way alarmed by your opponents—which is a sign of destruction for them, but of salvation for you, and that too, from God.
- ²⁹ For to you it has been granted for Christ's sake, not only to believe in Him, but also to suffer for His sake, ³⁰ experiencing the same conflict which you saw in me, and now hear to be in me.

²¹ For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain.

²⁷ Only conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ,

- 2. How does this section connect to previous section?
- 3. What the main topic of this section?
- 4. What is the flow of thought in this section?
 - a. Observe Prepositions, Conjunctions, Contrasts etc.
- 5. Is there a main command in this passage?
- 6. Is there any emphasis?
 - a. By use of emphatic words, repetition, structure, synonyms, tone?
- 7. What are the significant Terms & Definitions?
