
Study Question for Genesis 5

- 1. Verses one and two repeats a brief summary of the creation account of man. Why do you think God repeated this before going into the genealogy?
- 2. What repeated phrases do you notice throughout the chapter?
- 3. Do you notice any patterns in the number of years that the people lived?
- 4. Use a bible concordance to look up the meaning of the names of the people mentioned in the genealogy. See if you notice anything about the structure of the meaning of the names.
- 5. Who are the key figures named, and how are they connected back to Adam?
- 6. What is emphasized about **Enoch** that is unique compared to the others?
- 7. What is prophesied about Noah at his birth in verses 29?

Importance of Genealogies

- It connects God's redemptive work with the promised line of descendants.
 - 1 Chronicles 1:1–4
 - ¹Adam, Seth, Enosh, ²Kenan, Mahalalel, Jared, ³Enoch, Methuselah, Lamech, ⁴Noah, Shem, Ham and Japheth.
 - Mentioned in Luke 3:36-38 (Genealogy of Jesus)—biological line
- It's a record of God's faithfulness to His own promise.
 - 2 Timothy 2:11–13
 - 11 It is a trustworthy statement:
 - For if we died with Him, we will also live with Him;
 - 12 If we endure, we will also reign with Him;
 - If we deny Him, He also will deny us;
 - 13 If we are faithless, He remains faithful, for He cannot deny Himself.
- Genealogy emphasizes the creation mandate to be fruitful and multiply.

LIFESPANS OF THE BIBLICAL PATRIARCHS




Repetition of God's creation of man reminds us of the continuity of God's intent in creation.

- He made him in the likeness of God
 - Even the fallen man bears God's image.
 - It highlights the dignity of man's value.
- Male and female he created them.
 - The clear intent on God's value that both were created by God. (in a culture where women were dominated by men.
- He blessed them and named them Man.
 - God's universal blessing still remains even after the fall.
 - It emphasizes unity of the origin of mankind.

Notable people in the genealogy

- Enoch walked with the Lord
- Hebrews 11:5
- ⁵ By faith Enoch was taken up so that he would not see death; AND HE WAS NOT FOUND BECAUSE GOD TOOK HIM UP; for he obtained the witness that before his being taken up he was pleasing to God.
- Jude 14–16
- 14 It was also about these men that Enoch, in the seventh generation from Adam, prophesied, saying, "Behold, the Lord came with many thousands of His holy ones, 15 to execute judgment upon all, and to convict all the ungodly of all their ungodly deeds which they have done in an ungodly way, and of all the harsh things which ungodly sinners have spoken against Him." 16 These are grumblers, finding fault, following after their own lusts; they speak arrogantly, flattering people for the sake of gaining an advantage.

Notable people in the genealogy

- Methuselah (His death shall bring)
 - When he died the flood came.
- Noah—(comfort, rest)
 - Comfort and rest comes after the flood.

Matthew 24:37-39

"For the coming of the Son of Man will be just like the days of Noah. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noah entered the ark, and they did not understand until the flood came and took them all away; so will the coming of the Son of Man be."

Hebrews 11:7

"By faith Noah, being warned by God about things not yet seen, in reverence prepared an ark for the salvation of his household, by which he condemned the world, and became an heir of the righteousness which is according to faith."

• 1 Peter 3:20

"...who once were disobedient, when the patience of God kept waiting in the days of Noah, during the construction of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were brought safely through the water."

• 2 Peter 2:5

"...and did not spare the ancient world, but preserved Noah, a preacher of righteousness, with seven others, when He brought a flood upon the world of the ungodly."
