Acts 11:25 (MEV) Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul.

Barnabas saw what others did not see.

Barnabas did what others would not do.

Barnabas paid a price others would not pay.

Acts 4:36 Joseph, whom the apostles called Barnabas (which means, Son of Encouragement), a Levite from the land of Cyprus, sold a field he owned, and brought the money and placed it at the apostles' feet.

Acts 9:29 And he spoke boldly in the name of the Lord Jesus and disputed against the Hellenists. But they tried to kill him.

Acts 9:30 When the brothers learned this, they brought him down to Caesarea, and sent him off to Tarsus.

Acts 15:39 Then there arose a sharp contention, so that they separated from each other.

Acts 15:39-40 Barnabas took Mark and sailed to Cyprus, but Paul chose Silas and departed.
