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1. God's Plan Often Interrupts Our Plan: Acts 1:6–7; Matthew 28:19

- God's calling does not always align with our personal timelines or expectations.
- God's authority reminds us that His timing is wiser than ours.
- When our plans become primary, they can quietly replace obedience.

Discussion Questions

- Where have you felt tension between what you planned and what God may be calling you into?
- Why do you think trusting God's timing is often harder than trusting His purpose?

Follow-Up Prompt

- What would it look like to fully submit your plans to God this week?

2. Uncertainty Is Part of Calling, But Not a Reason to Stop: Acts 1:7

- Calling almost always involves uncertainty.
- Waiting can be wise, but fear can disguise itself as patience.
- Faith requires movement, even when clarity feels incomplete.

Discussion Questions

- Which response do you most relate to when you feel uncertain: wait, freeze, control, or move forward?
- How can you tell the difference between wisdom and fear in moments of decision?

Follow-Up Prompt

- What is one small step of faith God may be asking you to take right now?

3. God Supplies the Power for What He Calls Us To Do: Acts 1:8; Acts 2:1–4; Acts 8:14–17; Acts 19:1–2

- The Holy Spirit empowers believers to live out God's mission.
- God does not call us based on our ability, but on His power.
- The early church relied fully on the Holy Spirit, not personal strength.

Discussion Questions

- In what areas do you most often feel "I don't have what it takes"?
- How does the promise of the Holy Spirit change how we approach God's calling?

Follow-Up Prompt

- Where do you need to rely more on the Holy Spirit instead of your own effort?

4. When You Don't Know What to Do, Start Where You Are: Acts 1:8

- Information feeds a burden and helps clarify next steps.
- Movement brings direction; obedience creates momentum.
- God's mission expands outward, starting close and moving wider.

Discussion Questions

- What does "start where you are" look like in your life right now?
- Which part of the mission matrix feels most accessible to you at this season?

Follow-Up Prompt

- How can praying, giving, or going become more intentional for you this month?

Key Takeaways
