# **DEATH MESSED ME UP**

# November 25, 2018

**2 Corinthians 1:3-4** Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God.

### 1. GOD COMFORTS US

- A. We find comfort in the person of God.
  - Earthly things are temporary.
    - **2 Corinthians 4:16-18** Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal.
  - Death comes to us all.
- B. We find comfort in the character of God.
  - Hebrews 9:27 Just as people are destined to die once, and after that to face judgment,
  - Genesis 18:25 Will not the Judge of all the earth do right?"
- C. We find comfort in the promises of God.
  - **2 Corinthians 5:6-10** Therefore we are always confident and know that as long as we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord. For we live by faith, not by sight. We are confident, I say, and would prefer to be away from the body and at home with the Lord. So we make it our goal to please him, whether we are at home in the body or away from it. For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each of us may receive what is due us for the things done while in the body, whether good or bad.
  - **2 Corinthians 5:1** For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands.

### 2. GOD HELPS US COMFORT OTHERS

**2 Corinthians 1:3-4** Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God.

A. God is not distant in our death.

**Psalm 116:15** Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his faithful servants.

**John 11:33-36** When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who had come along with her also weeping, He was deeply moved in spirit and troubled. "Where have you laid him?" He asked. "Come and see, Lord," they replied. Jesus wept. Then the Jews said, "See how He loved him!"

- Jesus is moved by our loss.
- B. God desires to work through us to comfort others.
  - Grief is real.

### 3. WE HAVE HOPE

**2 Corinthians 1:7** And our hope for you is firm, because we know that just as you share in our sufferings, so also you share in our comfort.

**1 Corinthians 15:19** If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

A. We have hope because of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

**1 Corinthians 15:54-57** When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "Death has been swallowed up in victory." "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

B. Jesus' death and resurrection brought death to death and life to me.

**1 Corinthians 11:27-29** So then, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. Everyone ought to examine themselves before they eat of the bread and drink from the cup. For those who eat and drink without discerning the body of Christ eat and drink judgment on themselves.

**1 Corinthians 11:23-24** For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me."

**1 Corinthians 11:25-26** In the same way, after supper He took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.
