

HE IS ABLE

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1. God Is Able to Save: Hebrews 7:25; Romans 5:1; Romans 5:6–9; Matthew 28:19

- Jesus died to save us, once and for all.
- Salvation is not based on our effort, but on Christ's finished work.
- Because we have peace with God, we now live on mission for Him.

Discussion Questions

- What does it personally mean to you that Jesus "is able to save completely"?
- Why is it easy to drift from gratitude for salvation over time?
- How does remembering what Jesus did fuel our obedience to the Great Commission?

Follow-Up Prompt

- Who in your life needs to hear the message of salvation? Pray for them specifically this week.

Key Takeaways

- Salvation is secure in Christ.
- We never graduate from the wonder of the gospel.
- Saved people are sent people.

2. God Is Able to Help: Hebrews 2:18; 1 Corinthians 10:13

- Jesus understands suffering and temptation because He experienced both.
- God always provides a way of escape in temptation.
- Help is available, but we must come to Him.

Discussion Questions

- What kinds of temptations feel most common or intense in this season of life?
- What does it practically look like to "take the way out" God provides?
- Why do we sometimes try to fight temptation alone?

Follow-Up Prompt

- Identify one area of testing where you need God's help. What specific step can you take this week?

Key Takeaways

- You are never alone in your struggle.
- Temptation is common, but defeat is not inevitable.
- God's help is both present and practical.

3. God Is Able to Make You Strong: Romans 16:25; Joshua 1:9; 2 Corinthians 12:10

- Strength comes from God, not self-confidence.
- Courage grows from the awareness of God's presence.
- Weakness is not disqualifying; it is often the pathway to God's strength.

Discussion Questions

- Where do you currently feel weak or overwhelmed?
- How does knowing "the Lord your God is with you" change your perspective?
- What does it mean to say, "When I am weak, then I am strong"?

Follow-Up Prompt

- In what area do you need to stop striving and start depending?

Key Takeaways

- God strengthens surrendered people.
- Weakness can become a place of spiritual growth.
- Courage is rooted in God's presence.

4. God Is Able to Keep You from Falling Away: Jude 1:24; Psalms 119:11; Mark 12:30; Psalms 119:105

- In a world full of spiritual drift, God is able to keep us steady.
- He keeps us through His Word.
- He keeps us through loving Him fully.
- He keeps us through His direction and guidance.

Discussion Questions

- What most often causes people to drift spiritually?
- How does hiding God's Word in your heart protect you?
- What habits help you stay aligned with God's direction?

Follow-Up Prompt

- What daily or weekly rhythm could strengthen your spiritual stability?

Key Takeaways

- Staying close to God is intentional.
- The Word anchors us.
- Loving God fully guards our hearts.

5. God Is Able to Accomplish More: Ephesians 3:20

- His power works within us.
- God's plans are bigger than our imagination.
- Our role is obedience and surrender; His role is the outcome.

Discussion Questions

- Where have you limited God by small expectations?
- What would change if you truly believed God could do more than you can ask or think?
- How does the Holy Spirit empower everyday obedience?

Follow-Up Prompt

- Ask God this week to stretch your faith in one specific area.

Key Takeaways

- God's power is active, not distant.
- We partner with Him through faith and obedience.
- He is able to do more than we can see right now.

Optional Reflection and Prayer

Take a few quiet moments to reflect on what stood out most to you from this discussion.

- Where do you need to remember that God is able to save, not just others, but you fully and completely?
- Where do you need His help in temptation or testing right now?
- In what area do you feel weak and need His strength?
- Are there any patterns or distractions that could lead you to drift spiritually?
- Where might God be inviting you to trust Him for more than you have been asking or expecting?
