1. What is in my heart?

Psalms 139:19-22 If only You, God, would slay the wicked! Away from me, you who are bloodthirsty! They speak of you with evil intent; your adversaries misuse your name. Do I not hate those who hate you, LORD, and abhor those who are in rebellion against you? I have nothing but hatred for them; I count them my enemies.

Jeremiah 17:9-10 The heart is deceitful above all things and beyond cure. Who can understand it? "I the LORD search the heart and examine the mind, to reward each person according to their conduct, according to what their deeds deserve."

Psalms 139:1 You have searched me, LORD, and You know me.

Psalms 139:2 You know when I sit and when I rise; You perceive my thoughts from afar.
