works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.


#### **Confession of Sin**

Romans 3:23-24


For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus.



#### **Confession of Faith**

--The Heidelberg Catechism, Question #1

Minister: What is your only comfort in life and death?

He also preserves me in such a way that without the will of my heavenly Father not a hair can fall from my head; indeed, all things must work together for my salvation. Therefore, by His Holy Spirit He also assures me of

ready from now on to live for Him.

#### **Invitation and Prayer**

[Communion, also called The Lord's Supper or the Eucharist, is the family meal of Christians. We invite all committed followers of Jesus Christ to partake of this sacrament: those who are baptized members of a congregation which proclaims the gospel, who are at peace with God and with their neighbor, and who seek strength to live more faithfully for Christ. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer.]

Minister: The gifts of God for the people of God.


#### The Giving of the Bread and Cup
