Confession of Sin


Please pray aloud together

Romans 3:23-24


For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus.



Luke 15:1-10

The Table

Confession of Faith

Heidelberg Catechism, Question 60

Minister: How are you right with God?

All: Only by true faith in Jesus Christ. Even though my

conscience accuses me of having grievously sinned against all God's commandments and of never having kept any of them, and even though I am still inclined toward all evil, nevertheless, without my deserving it at all, out of sheer

grace, God grants and credits to me the perfect

satisfaction, righteousness, and holiness of Christ, as if I had never sinned or been a sinner, as if I had been as perfectly obedient as Christ was obedient for me. All I need to do is to accept this gift with a believing heart.

Invitation and Prayer

All: Christ has died. Christ is risen.

Christ will come again!

Minister: Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

All: Therefore let us keep the feast.

Minister: The gifts of God for the people of God.

[As you are ready please come forward to receive the bread and the cup. We provide individual cups of grape juice and gluten-free wafers in the tray at the front. We partake in the Supper by intinction, that is, we dip the bread into the cup. Children who have not yet professed their faith in Christ nor been admitted to the Table are encouraged to come forward for a prayer of blessing.]

Silent Prayers During Communion

Prayer for Covenant Children (Not Yet Confirmed): Lord Jesus, thank you for placing me inside your family, the church. Help me more and more to know you, to love you, and to follow you as your faithful disciple. Amen.

Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life that you promise. Amen.

Prayer of Belief: Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever before believed, but, through you, I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross and offering forgiveness and new life. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as Savior and Lord. Amen.

Prayer for Those Struggling with Sin: Lord Jesus, you have called me to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship in your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Grant also that I may see in you the fulfillment of all my need, and may turn from every false satisfaction to feed on you, the true and living bread. Enable me to lay aside the sin that clings so closely, and run with perseverance the race set before me, looking to you, the author and finisher of my faith. Amen.

Giving to MPC

While are a "mission church" our money will be handled by Reformed University Fellowship—the PCA office in Atlanta. They will provide receipts and tax reporting information for us. When you give money at church, we will send it to RUF for processing. RUF sets/oversees our church budget along with the Missions Team of our Presbytery.

When you donate through the link on the church website (http://mpctucson.org/donate) it goes into the same pot. You can send checks or use credit cards at that site. (Credit cards take a 2-3% fee out, just so you know.)

During this start up phase, Charles will see what people give to the church. This is generally undesirable, but is a necessary problem for now. This will change once we move our finances in house.

We want our church to generously support the cause of Jesus' Kingdom in the world. We intend to give 20% of the money we receive at MPC away to other Kingdom causes. Because of our special connection with the RUF ministry at U of A, we plan to give 5% to that work. Our Presbytery has asked us to contribute 5% to other church planting efforts in AZ and the Southwest (through the Presbytery's missions and the Southwest Church Planting Network.) Our contribution to the denomination's mission costs is about 1.5%. The rest we will invest together as God captures our imaginations for his work in the world.
