I will sing praises to you among the nations.


For your steadfast love is great to the heavens,



Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.** O God, everlasting Father, your kingdom comes by your power. We pray that you would bring your kingdom to us. 

³⁷ David himself calls him Lord. So how is he his son?" And the great throng heard him gladly.

Confession of Faith

-Heidelberg Catechism, Question 60

Minister: How are you right with God?

- We use the ancient creeds to reinforce our confidence in God's grace, and to highlight our connection to his people around the world who worship him with these same words every Lord's Day.
- All: Only by true faith in Jesus Christ. Even though my conscience accuses me of having grievously sinned against all God's commandments and of never having kept any of them, and even though I am still inclined toward all evil, nevertheless, without my deserving it at all, out of sheer grace, God grants and credits to me the perfect satisfaction, righteousness, and holiness of Christ, as if I had never sinned or been a sinner, as if I had been as perfectly obedient as Christ was obedient for me. All I need to do is to accept this gift with a believing heart. Amen.

Invitation and Prayer

[Communion, also called The Lord's Supper or the Eucharist, is the family meal of Christians. We invite all committed followers of Jesus Christ to partake of this sacrament: those who are baptized members of a congregation which proclaims the gospel, who are at peace with God and with their neighbor, and who seek strength to live more faithfully for Christ. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer.]

All:	We lift them up to the Lord.


The Words of Institution
