Such a visit, Lustig explained, would provide "a test of maturity before they received a drivers license or be allowed to vote or get married... I believe that this peek into hell would ripen their image of the world, for only those who have seen how little is needed to peel what is human from us – to turn us again into animals – can understand the world into which we are born."

Call to Worship—

Lighting of the Shepherd's Candle

The first candle in the Advent wreath, the Prophet's Candle, reminds us of the prophets' hope for God's salvation to come.

The second candle, the Peace Candle, reminds us of Jesus' humility in coming to earth and being born in a stall.

The third candle reminds us of the joy of the shepherds as they heard the good news of Jesus' arrival, for: "The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them" (Luke 2:20).

As we light the Shepherd's Candle we remember that it wasn't the rich and famous who came to worship Jesus that first Christmas Eve, but poor shepherds. Through Jesus Christ, God invites us, as his children, those who are "poor in spirit," to come into His presence and worship Him.

Let us stand and sing as we celebrate the coming of God to the world.



The Apostles' Creed

All: Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia!


Minister: The gifts of God for the people of God.


