Worship Note

The Apostles' Creed

The basic creed of Christian churches, as most familiarly known, is called the Apostles' Creed. The creed is called the Apostles' Creed not because it was produced by the apostles themselves but because it contains a brief summary of their teachings. It dates from very early times in the Church, a half century or so from the last writings of the New Testament.

Originally the creed was an elaboration of the baptismal rubric in which we are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. We don't just "say" or "recite" the creed, we *confess* our faith with it. As we confess, we join our voices with Christians around the world and through the centuries. The Apostles' Creed, then, is the most essential and succinct answer to the question, "Christians, what do you believe?"


Call to Worship



Confession of Sin


Please pray aloud together


Assurance of Forgiveness

Amen.


Old Testament Reading

James 1:26-27 Reader: The Word of the Lord. *People: Thanks be to God.*

How do you read it?" ²⁷ And he answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." ²⁸ And he said to him, "You have answered correctly; do this, and you will live."

²⁹ But he, desiring to justify himself, said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?"³⁰ Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and he fell among robbers, who stripped him and beat him and departed, leaving him half dead. ³¹ Now by chance a priest was going down that road, and when he saw him he passed by on the other side. ³² So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. ³³ But a Samaritan, as he journeyed, came to where he was, and when he saw him, he had compassion. ³⁴ He went to him and bound up his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he set him on his own animal and brought him to an inn and took care of him. ³⁵ And the next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper, saying, 'Take care of him, and whatever more you spend, I will repay you when I come back.' ³⁶ Which of these three, do you think, proved to be a neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?" ³⁷ He said, "The one who showed him mercy." And Jesus said to him, "You go, and do likewise."

All:	It is right to give Him thanks and praise.



Minister:	The gifts of God for the people of God.


The Giving of the Bread and Cup


