- 4. Try to go outside for visiting with each other after the service.
- 5. We will disinfect surfaces in the sanctuary and bathrooms before the service.

with obedience, as Mary;


with love, as you have loved us.

John 3:16



Leader: The Lord be with you.

Leader: Let us pray.

Our Lord Jesus Christ, You came into the world to destroy the works of the devil:

We ask you to restrain the wickedness in our city by your Law. We ask you to destroy the wickedness in our own

hearts by your Spirit. We pray that you would protect us from the temptations, deceit and accusations of the devil.

(Pray silently that God would deliver you from evil.)

Our Lord Jesus Christ,

You came into the world to bring us peace with God:

We pray for peace between nations in Your world; We pray that this congregation might live in your peace together; We ask you to come again soon to fully establish your peace on earth.

(Pray silently for God to bring peace to the earth.)

The prayers of the people enable us to join our minds and hearts in one voice to God, like we do when we sing. Be careful about merely repeating the words without engaging your whole self in prayer.

Our Lord Jesus Christ,

You came into the world to seek and save that which was lost:

We pray for our friends who do not yet know you; We ask you to deepen our faith in the gospel of grace.

(Pray silently for the spread of the good news.)

Our Lord Jesus Christ, You came into the world to destroy death and to bring life and immortality to light through the gospel:

We pray for comfort for those who are suffering

in grief,

in poverty,

in sickness,

in injustice.

(Pray silently for those who are suffering.)

Our Lord Jesus Christ,

We pray now in the words you taught us:

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name.

Thy Kingdom come.

Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors.

And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.

For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever.

Amen.



Confession of Faith The Apostles' Creed

If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer.]


