(Acts 2:4)

WIND & FIRE

Acts 2 records a moment of history-shaping power. A sound like a mighty rushing wind filled the house. Tongues of fire appeared. The Holy Spirit was poured out.

# God Did Not Fill Random People


Acts 2 shows us what happened, but it also reveals why. The outpouring wasn't an accident timing. God poured His Spirit into a specific type of vessel.

**He filled a prepared, purified, united, praying, Word-anchored people.**



# We Cannot Create the Wind

But we must raise the sails.



A sailboat does not manufacture power; it positions itself to receive it.

In the same way, the disciples didn't manufacture the Holy Spirit.

They positioned themselves in obedience to receive Him.

# Prepared Hearts

## Obedience & Expectation

### OBEDIENCE


“If you love me, you will keep my commandments... And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper.” — John 14:15–16

Jesus commanded them to wait (Acts 1:4). Love for Christ expresses itself in obedience, and obedience invites the Spirit’s work.

### EXPECTATION

“Whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him.” — Hebrews 11:6

They were not chasing experiences; they were following instructions, expecting God to keep His promise.

The disciples gathered with surrendered  
hearts, waiting actively for the wind of God.

# Purified Lives

Cleansing & Repentance

*“Therefore, if anyone cleanses himself from what is dishonorable, he will be a vessel for honorable use, set apart as holy, useful to the master of the house...”* — 2 Timothy 2:21

God fills empty, surrendered vessels—not cluttered ones. Repentance isn't just about guilt; it is about utility. A cleansed vessel is fit for the Master's use.

“Repent... that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord.”  
— Acts 3:19–20

# Peaceful Relationships

## Unity & Forgiveness

“Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers dwell in unity! ... It is like the precious oil...”  
(Psalm 133:1-2).

The disciples were ‘with one accord’ (Acts 2:1).

“If you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you... leave your gift there... First be reconciled.”  
(Matthew 5:23-24).

# Unresolved Conflict Restricts the Flow

# Persistent Prayer

Alignment & Consistency

*“How much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!” – Luke 11:13*

“These all continued with one accord in prayer...”  
(Acts 1:14)

“Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving.”  
(Colossians 4:2)

Key Concept:  
Prayer aligns the heart with God’s will. It expresses dependence.

# Oxygen for the Flame

Fire burns brightest when oxygen is steady. Prayer is the atmosphere required for the flame to survive.




*“Pray without ceasing” (1 Thessalonians 5:17) is the steady breath that keeps the fire alive.*

Truth & Guidance

(Colossians 3:16)




Word-filled believers are Spirit-directed believers. The Spirit uses Scripture to teach, reprove, correct, and train (2 Timothy 3:16–17).

# Staying on the Road

The same power that raised Jesus energizes daily living (Rom 8:11).


## **LEADING**
