


The Winning Walk With the Spirit

The Guide convicts and directs

- **The Promise of Conviction:** He will convict the world concerning sin, righteousness, and judgment (John 16:8). The Spirit opens eyes and draws sinners to Christ. Know the difference between Satan's accusations and the Spirit's convictions.
- **The Promise of Guidance:** When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth (John 16:13). He guides through Scripture, wisdom, counsel, and peace.

The Spirit does not just make promises; He leads believers into a daily walk. Step onto the path.

The path begins with adoption and freedom

- **No Condemnation:** (Romans 8:1-2)
- **Led as Sons:** “All who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God.” (Romans 8:14)
- **Assured as Children:** The Spirit whispers assurance in the believer's heart, leading lovingly, not harshly. (Romans 8:16)
- **Empowered in Weakness:** He intercedes when we don't know how to pray. (Romans 8:26)

Like riding in an autonomous car, you must learn to yield control and trust the One who is always trustworthy.





Fruit is the Spirit's production, not human effort

“But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control...” (Galatians 5:22–23)

“The Spirit does not make us perfect in the flesh, but He makes us progressive in grace.” — Charles Spurgeon

I am not better than others; I am better than I would be without the Holy Spirit.



Winning over our fleshly natures

“But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit... these are opposed to each other.”
(Galatians 5:16-17)

Every believer experiences internal conflict. Victory is dependence, not perfectionism. Anxiety comes when we face our insufficiency; peace comes when we trust God’s sufficiency.



The Christian life is a battleground, not a playground

The battle is not only internal—it is also external. The Spirit who produces fruit within us also equips us to stand against attacks from without. We must put on the whole armor of God to stand against the schemes of the devil (Ephesians 6:11).

“Spiritual victory does not come from mystical experiences but from disciplined obedience to revealed truth.” — John MacArthur

The armor for the winning walk

Sword of the Spirit (The Word of God):

The only offensive weapon.
Jesus defeated Satan with
"It is written."

Helmet of Salvation:

Guards the mind with
assurance (No condemnation!).

Shield of Faith:

Extinguishes flaming darts
of doubt and fear.



Belt of Truth:

The Spirit guides into
stabilizing truth.


Breastplate of Righteousness:

Christ's righteousness
applied to us.

Shoes of the Gospel of Peace:

Anchored in peace, ready
to tell the good news.

Praying at all times in the Spirit keeps every piece of armor in place (Ephesians 6:18).

Many believers fear losing the Spirit or being rejected.
But unlike in the Old Testament, He will not leave you.



Your salvation is securely sealed by the King

“...were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit.”
(Ephesians 1:13).

Once sealed, the sender has authority over the letter. Believers are sealed by God Himself—meaning ownership, security, and protection.

Sphragizō (σφραγίζω)

To mark with a seal for security, preservation, or as a guarantee of authenticity.

Guaranteed and completed by divine faithfulness

Salvation is not maintained by human effort. God has given us the Spirit as “earnest money”—a guarantee. (2 Corinthians 5:5, Philippians 1:6)

Yield daily.




Obey promptly.
