



TITLE: The Importance of Difficult Things

ICE BREAKER: What's a difficult situation in life that taught you something valuable?

BIG IDEA: "Wisdom" is knowing that the Difficult Times in life have a lot to teach us!

MAIN SCRIPTURE: Ecclesiastes 7:1-14

- 7** A good name is better than fine perfume,
and the day of death better than the day of birth.
- 2** It is better to go to a house of mourning
than to go to a house of feasting,
for death is the destiny of everyone;
the living should take this to heart.
- 3** Frustration is better than laughter,
because a sad face is good for the heart.
- 4** The heart of the wise is in the house of mourning,
but the heart of fools is in the house of pleasure.
- 5** It is better to heed the rebuke of a wise person
than to listen to the song of fools.
- 6** Like the crackling of thorns under the pot,
so is the laughter of fools.
This too is meaningless.
- 7** Extortion turns a wise person into a fool,
and a bribe corrupts the heart.
- 8** The end of a matter is better than its beginning,
and patience is better than pride.
- 9** Do not be quickly provoked in your spirit,
for anger resides in the lap of fools.
- 10** Do not say, "Why were the old days better than these?"
For it is not wise to ask such questions.

¹¹ Wisdom, like an inheritance, is a good thing
and benefits those who see the sun.

¹² Wisdom is a shelter
as money is a shelter,
but the advantage of knowledge is this:
Wisdom preserves those who have it.

¹³ Consider what God has done:

Who can straighten
what he has made crooked?

¹⁴ When times are good, be happy;
but when times are bad, consider this:

God has made the one
as well as the other.

Therefore, no one can discover
anything about their future.

Opening Thoughts: Life often seems to be filled with difficult things – difficult people, difficult situations, problems that seem to be over our head, and so much more. It's often in those time that we feel distant from God, confused by his will, or even find ourselves fighting against our faith. Yet through these verses The Preacher (Solomon) wants us to think differently about difficult things. He helps us by using parables, to understand that they're more valuable than we think!
