⁴² And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. ⁴³ And awe came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. ⁴⁴ And all who believed were together and had all things in common. ⁴⁵ And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need. ⁴⁶ And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, ⁴⁷ praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved. Acts 2:42-47

The writer's words are a picture and a prophecy of the new Testament church - a family who believes the gospel, on mission where their life exists. Three thousand people believe on Jesus and are moved by the Spirit to eat together, study the teaching of the apostles together, share their financial resources with one another, and visit their former place of worship to tell them that God has sent his Messiah that would save them from their sins and his name is Jesus.

This sense of community in the early church, was imitated by Irenaeus and the early church fathers, Augustine and the desert monks, St. Patrick and his missionary band in Ireland, the slaves of the North American continent, Dr. Bonhoeffer and the Finkenwalde seminary students, and many more. Each local church being the church in their everyday life as they were moving along in life.

WHO?

Resurrection Houston was founded with the goal of being a gospel-centered community with values that arise out of Acts church — gospel, family, mission, multiplication, and social justice. Out of the original body from 2012 we are now three church bodies - Houston, Detroit (Refuge Detroit), and North Carolina (Kainos Charlotte).
