One of the simple skills we learn as kids is how to bounce a ball. Can you bounce a ball like this? Switch to flat ball. Are you sure? Everyone knows you can't bounce a ball with no air in it. This ball was created to hold air. Without air it cannot accomplish what it was designed to do. It is still a ball; it just can't bounce.

Until we are filled with the air of God's Spirit, we cannot accomplish what we were designed to accomplish. The same goes for churches. A church without the Holy Spirit is like a ball without air. That partially explains why there are so many churches in this country, but it seems to make very little difference in the culture. A. W. Tozer observed that "If the Holy Spirit was withdrawn from the church today, 95 percent of what we do would go on and **no one** would know the difference. If the Holy Spirit had been withdrawn from the NT church (in Acts), 95 percent of what they did would stop, and **everyone** would know the difference."

In the first chapter of Acts, Jesus promised to provide the power to pursue His purpose... Acts 1:8. In the second chapter He makes good on His--promise and **His power transforms the ordinary into something extraordinary.**

Ordinary days become extraordinary events... vv. 1-4. The occasion is Pentecost which means 50th. Pentecost or Shavuoth designates the 50th day after Passover which culminated in a festival called the Feast of Weeks or First Fruits. This was one of the three big festivals of Israel that every male Jew was required to attend in Jerusalem. Pentecost commemorated two things: the giving of the Law and the first fruits of the harvest. The Jews celebrated Pentecost every year. God had prepared His people for the coming of the Holy Spirit 50 days after the resurrection.

What happened on the first Pentecost after the resurrection was something much different from what happened when Moses received the law. In Ex. 32, Moses comes down from the mountain where he received the law, and the people are worshiping a golden calf. He was so angry he threw down the tablets and ordered the death of3,000 men. In Acts 2:41 we learn that 3,000 were saved. The Law was delivered in Ex. 32 resulting in death. The Spirit is delivered in Acts 2 resulting in life. To know the law without having the Spirit leads to death. "But now we have been released from the Law, having died to that by which we were bound, so that we serve in newness of the Spirit and not in oldness of the letter." Ro. 7:6 "But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the Law." Gal. 5:18. "Christ redeemed us from the curse of the Law..." Gal. 3:13. The Law is a curse because it shows us what is wrong but cannot help us do what is right. We need His Spirit, otherwise we are like a ball without air.

Sometimes the Spirit of God overtakes a very ordinary moment. God transforms the ordinary. I was in a clothing store recently and one of the workers called me by name. She had attended Fellowship years ago. She told me that she had become a Christian during one of my messages. I was desperate to know what I preached so that I can use it every Sunday! Of course, it wasn't my sermon that led to her conversion. It was the Holy Spirit drawing her to Himself. In the OT the Holy Spirit spoke through a donkey. Apparently, He still does! Ordinary days can become extraordinary events.

Ordinary people possess extraordinary abilities... vv. 5-11. God gets the attention of those visiting Jerusalem by the preaching of unlearned men in languages they have never studied. This extraordinary gift of language occurs on four occasions in Acts. Each time it is used as a confirming sign of God's intervention. In Acts 2 the Jews hear the Gospel. In Acts 8:17 the Samaritans. In Acts 10:44 the Gentiles. In Acts 19:6 a group of disciples who didn't even know about the Holy Spirit. Tongues were a sign authenticating the work of salvation. The danger we face in reading Acts is trying to apply that which inaugurates a new work of God in our current context to make it normative. Just because they heard a wind and saw flames of fire doesn't mean we will. God's Spirit can also show up as a still small voice.

Ordinary handyman working on friend's house. When asked what he wanted to be paid to do the job the man said, "I just want as much of the Holy Spirit as I can get." Later he invited the homeowner to go with him to the hospital to pray for a lady in a coma. He went. This soft-spoken man became a force as he prayed. Later that day, the lady came out of the coma. God heard the ordinary prayer of this ordinary man and did something extraordinary. Ordinary people under the influence of the Holy Spirit can accomplish extraordinary things.

Ordinary appeals achieve extraordinary response ... vv. 14 - 41. The response to God's intervention is predictable. There were those hard-hearted people that were not interested in what God was doing who attacked the messengers. "They're drunk." Then there were those who were in awe of what was taking place.

Peter, the comeback kid, addresses the crowd. Just a few weeks earlier he had denied Christ. He had been full of pride and presumption. After his post-resurrection encounter with Jesus on the shore of the Sea of Galilee, he was a new man. In Acts 2, he experienced a fullness of the Spirit of God.

Peter's sermon wouldn't win any preaching awards. It is simple, scriptural, Christ-centered, and it called for a commitment. In Acts 2:16-35 Peter uses the OT to support his belief in Jesus as the promised Messiah. The result? Vv. 37-41. Peter doesn't even give an invitation. The people give the invitation.

What then shall WE do? "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

Paul adds to Peter's response in Eph. 5:18. "Keep being filled with the Holy Spirit." So here is a suggestion. Let's practice "spiritual breathing."

Exhale- You can't fill what is already full. Take a moment to expel anything in your mind that is cluttering your life... pride, ambition, worry, lust. As God brings it to mind, renounce it.

Inhale - How do I do that? Let me show you a chart that compares two parallel passages on the subject. (See chart cf. Eph/Col.)

"Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly" and be filled with the Holy Spirit. Without God's Spirit, we are like a ball without air. We live out our ordinary days doing ordinary things fulfilling our ordinary obligations to ordinary religion. But filled with the Spirit we can accomplish great things, extraordinary things.

You and I are tempted every day in our lives and in our churches to do the work of God apart from the power of the Spirit of God... The greatest hindrance to the advancement of the gospel in our day may be the attempt for the people of God to attempt to do the work of God without the Spirit of God. Maybe the greatest barrier to the spread of the gospel is not the self-indulgent immorality of our culture but the self-sufficient mentality of the church. Let's pray (exhale/inhale).

ORDINARY DAYS BECOME EXTRAORDINARY EVENTS.

2 When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place.

ORDINARY APPEALS ACHIEVE EXTRAORDINARY RESULTS.

14 But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them: "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words. 15 For these people are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day. 16 But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel: 17 "'And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams;
