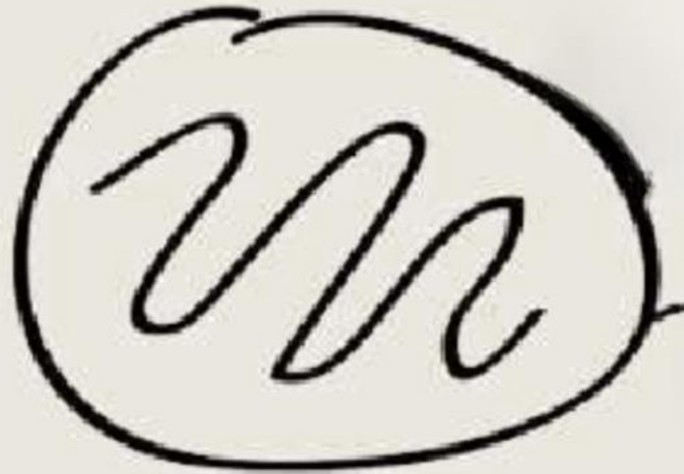
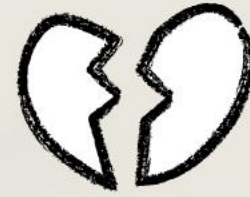

3 Circles

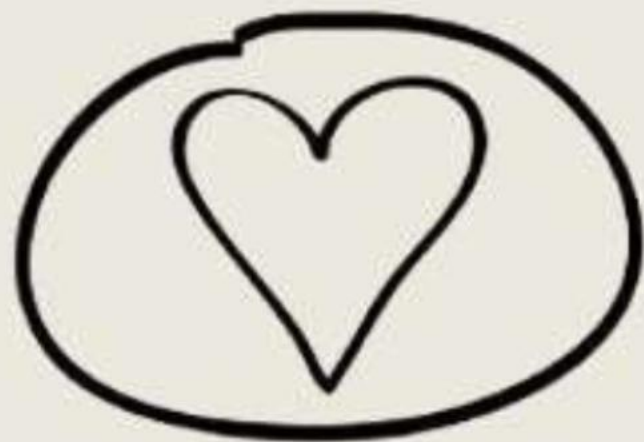
