The Word Became Flesh

We hope this material will continue to minister as the sermon was preached during our weekly worship service. When we receive God's Word at church, we need not only to hear the message, but we ought to walk it out in our daily lives. We should "be doers of the word, not only hearers." (James 1:22)

- Step 1: GET TOGETHER with your family or group.
- Step 2: REVIEW the key points and scriptures from the message.
- Step 3: SHARE with your group what God is saying to you through the message.
- Step 4: PRAY together, for each other and over each other to continue to walk this word out.

The Big Idea

The Word of God is not just something we hear or read—it's meant to become part of us, manifested in our daily lives. Just as Jesus was the Word made flesh, we are called to embody the Word through obedience, faith, and transformation. True spiritual growth doesn't come just from knowing the Word but from living it out. God has elevated His Word above His name (Psalm 138:2), and that shows how much He values it.

Don't Miss This Point!

Read John 14:15. Obedience is the first way we manifest the Word of God. Jesus clearly said, "If you love Me, keep My commandments." This isn't about religious performance—it's about relationship. Obedience isn't burdensome; it's beneficial. When we build our lives on the Word, we're creating a foundation that can't be shaken. Obeying God's Word brings protection, prosperity (Deut 28), and spiritual light (Ps 119:105). Obedience isn't just evidence of love—it's the pathway to abundant life.

Another Great Point!

Read Matthew 6:22-23. We must be careful about what enters our hearts through the three main gates: eyes, mouth, and ears. The eye is the lamp of the body—what we look at shapes who we become. What we speak frames our world (Hebrews 11:3), and what we hear either builds faith or breeds fear (Rom 10:17). We're constantly being shaped by what we consume, so we must guard these gates with intentionality, knowing they determine the fruitfulness of our lives.

One Last Point!

Read Luke 8:18. Jesus warned us to "take heed how you hear." Distraction, disinterest, or a hardened heart can keep the Word from taking root. Like the parable of the sower (*Matt 13*), only the good ground produces lasting fruit. We must engage the Word with understanding and readiness to respond. Faith that leads to a breakthrough begins when we hear the Word with expectation and let it transform us.

Let's Be Doers!

We're not just called to receive the Word—we're called to *become* the Word made flesh in our generation. Let the Word shape your thoughts, speech, decisions, and relationships. Take practical steps to guard your eyes, speak life, and listen with spiritual hunger. Get under the preaching of the Word, meditate on it daily, and obey what it says. It leads to lasting deliverance, healing, and change.
