

Sermon Discussion Guide for I AM Worship Church Second Wind, Same God

We hope this material will continue to minister as the sermon was preached during our weekly worship service. When we receive God's Word at church, we need not only to hear the message, but we ought to walk it out in our daily lives. We should "be doers of the word, not only hearers." (James 1:22)

- Step 1: GET TOGETHER with your family or group.
- Step 2: REVIEW the key points and scriptures from the message.
- Step 3: SHARE with your group what God is saying to you through the message.
- Step 4: PRAY together, for each other and over each other to continue to walk this word out.

The Big Idea

God is still breathing new life into what looks dead, scattered, or hopeless. Just like in Ezekiel's vision of the dry bones (Ezekiel 37:1–10), God's Spirit has the power to revive, restore, and realign what seems beyond repair. The same God who raised an army out of bones can give you a second wind. The question is: will you believe He can breathe life into your valley and speak His Word over what feels finished?

Don't Miss This Point!

Read Matthew 19:26. Even when we stand in a valley of dry bones—when things look completely lifeless—God is setting us up for revival. What looks like the end is actually a beginning. Jesus tells us, "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible." Your valley isn't your final destination; it's the place where God wants to reveal His glory.

Another Great Point!

Read Ezekiel 37:1-6. God calls us to speak His Word over dead places. He told Ezekiel, "Prophesy to these bones and say to them, 'Dry bones, hear the word of the Lord'". We are not powerless spectators—we have authority through Christ to declare life, hope, and restoration over what looks broken. When we open our mouths and align with God's Word, heaven responds.

One Last Point!

Read Ezekiel 37:7-10. The breath of God turns scattered bones into a living army. Ezekiel 37:10 says, "So I prophesied as He commanded me, and breath came into them, and they lived and stood upon their feet, an exceedingly great army." God doesn't just want to patch things up—He wants to raise us up with purpose, unity, and strength. His Spirit transforms hopelessness into victory and prepares His people to impact the world as a force for His Kingdom.

Let's Be Doers!

Don't just acknowledge what's broken—begin to speak God's promises over it. Prophesy over your marriage, your family, your ministry, your future, and even your church. Say out loud, "Live!" where the enemy has spoken death. This week, pray daily for God's fresh wind to blow in your life and through our church. Invite someone to experience that breath of God with you at Friends & Family Day. Step into your valley with faith and declare: *Dry bones, hear the Word of the Lord!*
