

Sermon Discussion Guide for I AM Worship Church Kingdom Impact

We hope this material will continue to minister as the sermon was preached during our weekly worship service. When we receive God's Word at church, we need not only to hear the message, but we ought to walk it out in our daily lives. We should "be doers of the word, not only hearers." (James 1:22)

- Step 1: GET TOGETHER with your family or group.
- Step 2: REVIEW the key points and scriptures from the message.
- Step 3: SHARE with your group what God is saying to you through the message.
- Step 4: PRAY together, for each other and over each other to continue to walk this word out.

The Big Idea

Kingdom authority is not meant to stop with us—it is meant to flow through us into action that creates lasting influence. Jesus said we are the salt of the earth and the light of the world (Matthew 5:13–16). Salt preserves and flavors; light exposes and guides. In the same way, our actions under God's authority are meant to transform the world around us. The crown of glory we've received from God is not for display, but for impact. The real question is: will we keep our authority to ourselves, or will we use it to influence our homes, workplaces, schools, and communities for the Kingdom of God?

Don't Miss This Point!

Read Matthew 5:13-16. Small, faithful actions create ripples of influence far greater than you realize. A word of encouragement, a choice to live with integrity, or an act of love can change the culture of a family, a workplace, or even a community. Jesus taught that we are salt and light, bringing preservation, flavor, truth, and guidance to a decaying and dark world.

Another Great Point!

Read 1 Corinthians 3:6-9. Kingdom influence multiplies through relationships. Every time you pour into others—whether by planting seeds of truth, encouraging them in their faith, or praying faithfully—you participate in the expansion of the Kingdom. Relationships are the soil where Kingdom seeds take root. Your role may seem small or unseen, but God uses our obedience to multiply His influence in ways that impact generations.

One Last Point!

Read Colossians 1:10-12. Kingdom impact leaves a lasting legacy. Success is not measured by your temporary achievements, but by the eternal influence you leave behind. Like a tree planted near water that produces fruit for generations, your Kingdom actions create a legacy that outlives us and points others to Christ.

Let's Be Doers!

This week, step intentionally into your spheres of influence. At home, at work, at school, or in your neighborhood, choose one action that reflects Kingdom values—love, integrity, generosity, or courage. Don't settle for casual Christianity; let your life be salt that preserves truth and light that guides others to Jesus. Reflect at the end of the week: *Where did my actions create ripples of impact?*
