



5 Day Devotionals for I AM Worship Church **Don't Miss The Season (Week 1)**

Day 1: The Danger of Missing Your Moment

Reading: Luke 19:41-44

Devotional: Jesus wept over Jerusalem not because the people were absent, but because they were present yet blind to what God was doing. They threw a parade without recognizing the Savior. How often do we go through spiritual motions—attending church, praying, serving—yet miss the divine moment?

Recognition without response equals ignorance. Today, ask yourself: Am I truly present to what God is doing in my life right now? Don't settle for religious routine when God is offering divine encounter. The tragedy isn't being far from God; it's being close yet unaware. Open your spiritual eyes today and ask God to help you see what He's doing in this season.

Reflection Question: What spiritual moment might I be present for but absent from its meaning?

Day 2: Everything Has a Season

Reading: Ecclesiastes 3:1-8

Devotional: Solomon declares that everything—not some things, but everything—has a season. Your marriage, your ministry, your struggles, your breakthroughs all operate within divine timing. Wisdom isn't just knowing what season you're in; it's knowing what heaven requires from you while you're in it. Are you fighting a pruning season when God is cutting away dead weight? Are you rushing toward harvest without completing the preparation? Some believers pray for restoration of what God Himself has already closed. Others cling to old seasons while God is beckoning them forward. Today, ask God for discernment to recognize your current season and the courage to respond appropriately.

Reflection Question: What season am I in, and what is God requiring from me right now?



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Day 3: Recognition Demands Response

Reading: Numbers 13:25-14:4

Devotional: Israel stood at the threshold of promise but retreated in fear. The next morning, filled with regret, they tried to claim what yesterday's disobedience had forfeited. The season had passed. Moses warned them, but they went anyway and were defeated. This reveals a sobering truth: 99% obedience is 100% disobedience. Delayed obedience is still disobedience. Recognition without response is the same as ignorance. You can sense God moving, feel the shift coming, and still miss it by failing to act. The invitation hasn't expired, but seasons don't stay open forever. Today is your moment. What step of faith is God asking you to take right now? Don't wait until tomorrow to obey today's command.

Reflection Question: What am I recognizing that I haven't yet responded to?

Day 4: The Power of Pursuit

Reading: 2 Kings 2:1-14

Devotional: Fifty prophets witnessed the transition from a distance. One man inherited the mantle. The difference wasn't intelligence, spirituality, or gifting—it was pursuit. Elisha refused every distraction, every comfortable stopping point, every voice telling him to stay back. Three times he declared, "I will not leave you." This is individual pursuit at its finest. Nobody could make that decision for Elisha, and nobody can make it for you. But notice: his pursuit happened within a community that recognized the season. Your hunger is harder to sustain when surrounded by people who've settled for less. Today, refuse to be a spectator of what God is doing. Press through every distraction until the mantle falls.

Reflection Question: Am I witnessing transitions or inheriting mantles?



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Day 5: Synced with the Father

Reading: John 5:19-20

Devotional: Jesus, fully God with all authority, said, "I do nothing by myself; I only do what I see the Father doing." He ministered from awareness, intimacy, and real-time sensitivity to heaven's activity. At the pool of Bethesda, surrounded by multitudes of sick people, He healed one man—not from lack of compassion, but from alignment with the Father's specific assignment. Jesus could discern the difference between proximity and pursuit. Many people were near Him, but He stopped for those reaching out with real faith. You can be in church every week and still be in the crowd, or you can press through everything and walk out changed. The difference isn't distance—you're already here. The difference is what you're reaching for.

Reflection Question: Am I aligned with what the Father is doing, or am I acting from visible need alone?

Closing Prayer

Father, awaken us to the seasons You've placed us in. Give us eyes to see what You're doing and courage to respond before the moment passes. We refuse to be passive spectators. We choose pursuit over comfort, obedience over observation, and alignment over independence. Help us discern not just the season, but what You require from us within it. We won't leave this season without our blessing. In Jesus' name, Amen.
