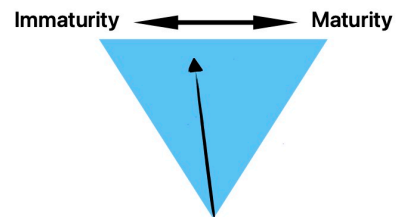
Weekly Questions:

- How is God getting my attention? For help, think about these areas:
 - How are you living up with God?
 - How are you living in community with other followers of Jesus?
 - How are you living out on mission with your neighbors?
- What are you going to do about it?

Luke 22:7-38

Not all growth is good.

- Describe ways that growth or success can be immature or unhelpful.
- Read Luke 22:7-16. What do we learn about how “dying to live” shapes the maturing process? What does it look like to choose humility, service, and patience in a relationship?
- Read Luke 22:17-23. Cross-shaped maturity will come with sabotage or betrayal. Can you describe a time when you were experiencing breakthrough and sabotage happened alongside of the growth in your life? Instead of fearing sabotage or betrayal, how might we see those experiences as sites for grace to work?



Read Luke 22:24-30. God rarely calls the equipped; God equips the called.

- What does it say about who Jesus is that he calls such a rag-tag group of disciples that fight about who is the best and betray him when it matters? How does this make room for you in God's kingdom and leadership?
- Read Luke 22:31-38. Jesus sends wounded healers into the world to live on mission. How do we dismiss this call in our lives by thinking we aren't qualified or have too many issues?
- How does sharing our wounds with others help to break down the way people think about Christians? How might your roundedness point others to Jesus?
- How can our church continue to name the ways God is inviting us to mature as a way to build bridges with our neighbors?

After reflection, what are you going to do about what you learned this week?
