



Discipleship Guide The Good Shepherd Knows Your Name John 10

This guide was created to help you engage with the message and create deeper engagement with our worship services. Each week this guide will encourage you to reflect on two primary questions using the framework of Up (with God), In (with church) and Out (with neighbors). As we use this guide to reflect on the scriptures and your relationship with God, each other and your neighbors, consider pausing for a moment in quiet before jumping into the questions.

Weekly Questions:

- How is God getting my attention? For help, think about these areas:
 - · How are you living up with God?
 - How are you living in community with other followers of Jesus?
 - · How are you living out on mission with your neighbors?
- What are you going to do about it?

John 10:1-21

Every single person is known by name by the Good Shepherd.

- What does it mean to you that there is a God who knows you by name?
- What does it mean to you that the Good Shepherd knows your name and lays down their life for you?
- What is the difference between a hired hand and the Good Shepherd?

The Good Shepherd is calling new sheep into the flock!

- What do we learn about the Good Shepherd by their willingness to find sheep in other pastures?
- Describe what abundant life looks like in your everyday life.

Will people learn about the hired hands or Good Shepherd from the way you live this week?

How will you listen to the Good Shepherd's voice this week? Be practical and specific.

For our kids (and adults too!):

How does your life help others to hear the voice of the Good Shepherd?

After reflection, what are you going to do about what you learned this week?
