Christmas Eve Offering: Christmas is a season of giving in remembrance of what God has given to us in the gift of Jesus. We celebrate at Mt. Zion by taking an offering to bless those around us in need. This year's offering will be divided in three ways:

- **Local**: Lunch debt is growing at some of our local schools as many families are out of work or not being paid. We will again bless families at Fairbrook Elementary School by paying down lunch debt.
- **National**: Our newly adopted church plant, Rosemont Christian Church, has begun a campaign to renovate their older building. This is a great opportunity to begin our relationship with them by blessing them in an unexpected way.
- **Global**: The persecution of Christians has increased worldwide, yet the church is growing where Christianity is illegal. Global Catalytic Ministries supports church planters in these nations, training disciples in 71 countries—focusing on former Muslims in hostile regions—to evangelize neighbors and build the underground church in their home countries.

Expected: Bethlehem fulfilled prophecy and connected the Messiah to David.

• **UNEXPECTED**: Bethlehem did not fulfill the prestige expected of the Messiah.

Expected: The Messiah would be the Good Shepherd.

• **UNEXPECTED**: The Messian would be the Lamb of God.

Expected: The Messiah would be a King like David.

• **UNEXPECTED**: The Messiah would be more like David the shepherd than David the King.
