Overview of John 12:20-50

John 12:19 So the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after him."

Verses 44-50: Jesus Explains Eternal Life



John 12:20-26

Now among those who went up to worship at the feast were some Greeks. 21 So these came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." 22 Philip went and told Andrew; Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. 23 And Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified.

John 12:25


Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life.



Point Three: What Jesus wants them to do

John 12:26

If anyone serves me, he must follow me; and where I am, there will my servant be also. If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him.



Who can be a follower of Jesus?

John 12:36-37

"While you have the light, believe in the light, that you may become sons of light." When Jesus had said these things, he departed and hid himself from them. 37 Though he had done so many signs before them, they still did not believe in him



What do we do with unbelief?

- 2 Things John is doing in John 12:37-43
- 1. Reminding us of <u>John 1:11</u> "He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him."



What do we do with unbelief?

2 Things John is doing in John 12:37-43

2. We are called to share with all peoples regardless of their "receptivity."

<u>Isaiah 6:8</u> And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here I am! Send me."

<u>Isaiah 6:10</u> Make the heart of this people dull
