Loving God & Loving Our Neighbor

But when the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together. And one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" And he said to him, "You shall *love the Lord your God* with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall *love your neighbor* as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets."






Shema Statements

Deuteronomy 6:4-7


"Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might."




"You will never be able to let your love for God flow into your everyday language unless you actually love God. People can tell when our words are a genuine expression of who we are, and when we're merely attempting to appear a certain way" (King, 154).





"Living out loud doesn't mean we're flamboyant, obnoxious, or provocative. It simply means that we bring the same enthusiasm to talking about God that we naturally demonstrate when talking about other things we're excited about and committed to and that we believe are important" (King, 14).






How do we know who is spiritually receptive?

"Spiritual receptivity is something we discover **as** we engage with people, not **before** we engage with them. The better way to interact with others is like this:


Step 1. Engage people with spiritual things. Step 2. Through engaging, find those who are spiritually receptive" (King, 35).





The Power of Curiosity


"Living a sent life means we're curious about others as a way to build connection that leads to gospel conversations" (Holleman, 146).





The Power of Curiosity

"Curiosity . . . reflects a way to love others well and care about their lives. Socially curious people love learning about others because they hold a posture of high regard for them; their desire to learn more about others dignifies them and imagines them hiding rich treasures of experiences, insights, and wisdom. When we allow ourselves to feel curious about other people's lives, we essentially believe that we will discover something meaningful and valuable from this interaction" (Holleman, 146-147).





The Importance of Prayer

- Jesus prayed for His disciples (John 17)
- Jesus prayed all night before calling His disciples (Luke 6:12)
- Prayer is part of the spiritual armor (Eph. 6:10–20)
- We can pray in the middle of a conversation (Neh. 2:4–5)
- Paul requested the churches to pray for him (Eph. 6:18–20;
 Col. 4:2–4)
- We are called to "pray without ceasing" (1 Thess. 5:17)

Jesus' Strategy for Raising Up Global Ministry Partners

- He called 12 disciples to follow Him (John 1:35-51; Matt 1:18-22; Mk 3:13-19; Lk 6:12-16)
- He did life and ministry together with the disciples
- He commissioned His disciples to go into all the world and make disciples (Matt 28:19-20; Mk 16:15; Lk 24:44-49; Jn 20:21; Acts 1:8)

Walking as Jesus Walked

"By this we may know that we are in him: whoever says he abides in him ought to walk in the same way in which he walked"
