Now Joshua was old and advanced in years, and the LORD said to him, "You are old and advanced in years, and there remains yet very much land to possess.² This is the land that yet remains: all the regions of the Philistines, and all those of the Geshurites ³ (from the Shihor, which is east of Egypt, northward to the boundary of Ekron, it is counted as Canaanite; there are five rulers of the Philistines, those of Gaza, Ashdod, Ashkelon, Gath, and Ekron), and those of the Avvim, ⁴ in the south, all the land of the Canaanites, and Mearah that belongs to the Sidonians, to Aphek, to the boundary of the Amorites, ⁵ and the land of the Gebalites...

Joshua 13:1-7 (ESV)

...and all Lebanon, toward the sunrise, from Baal-gad below Mount Hermon to Lebo-hamath, ⁶ all the inhabitants of the hill country from Lebanon to Misrephoth-maim, even all the Sidonians. I myself will drive them out from before the people of Israel. Only allot the land to Israel for an inheritance, as I have commanded you. ⁷ Now therefore divide this land for an inheritance to the nine tribes and half the tribe of Manasseh."

⁴⁹ When they had finished distributing the several territories of the land as inheritances, the people of Israel gave an inheritance among them to Joshua the son of Nun. ⁵⁰ By command of the LORD they gave him the city that he asked, Timnath-serah in the hill country of Ephraim. And he rebuilt the city and settled in it. ⁵¹ These are the inheritances that Eleazar the priest and Joshua the son of Nun and the heads of the fathers' houses of the tribes of the people of Israel distributed by lot at Shiloh before the LORD, at the entrance of the tent of meeting. So they finished dividing the land.

God is Faithful to Fulfill His Promises

- If you delight yourself in him, that he will give you the desires of your heart. (Psalm 37:4)
- Wisdom if we ask him for it. (James 1:5)
- A way out of temptation. (1 Cor 10:13)
- Our salvation is secure. (John 10:28-29)
- He will never leave us, nor forsake us. (Heb 13:5)
- He will finish the good work that he has begun in us. (Phil 1:6)
- He will return to one day set all things right. (Rev 21:5)

So Joshua took the whole land, according to all that the LORD had spoken to Moses. And Joshua gave it for an inheritance to Israel according to their tribal allotments. And the land had rest from war. Joshua 11:23

Now Joshua was old and advanced in years, and the LORD said to him, "You are old and advanced in years, and *there remains yet very much land to possess*. Joshua 13:1

Joshua devoted them to destruction with their cities. There was none of the Anakim left in the land of the people of Israel. Only in Gaza, in Gath, and in Ashdod *did some remain*. Joshua 11:21b-22



Joshua 10:36-39 – Debir is Captured They "devoted it and every person in it to destruction"

Joshua 15:13-15 – Caleb has Debir Recaptured "he went up from there against the inhabitants of Debir..."



Explanation #1: The book of Joshua uses exaggerated hyperbolic speech to describe their victories (this was common practice for others at the time)






Explanation #1: The book of Joshua uses exaggerated hyperbolic speech to describe their victories (this was common practice for others at the time)
