



Background (Acts 17:1-9)

- During his 2nd missionary journey, Paul and companions visit Thessalonica
- It is the capital of the Romancontrolled Macedonia
- After preaching at the Synagogue for three weeks, and likely more time ministering outside the synagogue, many Jews and Gentiles come to faith
- Fierce opposition arises leading Paul and his companions to flee





Background (1 Thessalonians)

- Out of concern for the young Thessalonian church, Paul sends Timothy to check on their welfare
- Timothy visits and then reunites with Paul in Corinth—delivering good news about the Thessalonians perseverance in the faith
- Paul writes 1 Thessalonians (to a church that is possibly still just 6 months old!)



¹Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace. ² We give thanks to God always for all of you, constantly mentioning you in our prayers, ³ remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. 4 For we know, brothers loved by God, that he has chosen you, 5 because our gospel came to you not only in word, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction. You know what kind of men we proved to be among you for your sake. ⁶ And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for you received the word in much affliction, with the joy of the Holy...




The Gospel Must Be Amplified

For not only has the word of the Lord sounded forth from you in Macedonia and Achaia, but your faith in God has gone forth everywhere, so that we need not say anything.

Sounded forth = exécheó (Greek): to make a loud sound
