How do we respond to this?

>> We groan, with Godly grief over our brokenness.

How do we respond to this?

- >> We groan specifically for the redemption of our bodies!
- >> Expressions of anguish are expressions of faith.

1 Corinthians 15:20


>> Jesus was the first of many to be raised! We will have, in the age to come, resurrected bodies.

>> Second: We remember...our honest questioning should always lead to active remembering.

Verse 10 & 11:

""And I said this. "This is my anguish; <u>But</u> I will remember the years of the right hand of the Most High.

I will remember the deeds of the LORD; yes I will remember your wonders of old."

Two-fold remembering:

- 1) We Remember who God is in Redemptive History.
- 2) We remember who God has been in Our Lives.




Encouragement for the friend of the sufferer...

"When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written:


"Death is swallowed up in victory."

O death, where is your sting?"


The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."





